

HOW SHOULD YOU BEGIN?

1.



Submit a copy of your unofficial transcript and completed coursework to begin the evaluation process.

2.



Chat with an enrollment advisor to get help obtaining official transcripts from your previous institution(s) at no cost.

3.



Your previous coursework or degree is reviewed against your intended program of study.

4.



Receive a transfer of credit pre-evaluation within 3 business days. It will include a summary of courses that may be accepted upon receipt of final transcript(s) and program of study.†

PRE-EVALUATION vs. EVALUATION

It's important to note that pre-evaluation and evaluation have different meanings.

Pre-evaluation is for students who have not applied to a program. This type of evaluation is completed within 3 business days and includes a preliminary summary of the courses that have been identified for transfer credit.



Evaluation occurs at the time of admission into a program, and it's generally completed at the time of admission review. This is the formal review of your previous coursework and determines your program of study at Walden.
